**WALKING IN THE HOLY SPIRIT**

The following passages show us the important role the Holy Spirit has in our daily lives. Please look each of them up this week and be prepared with questions on any of them next week.

<i>Passage</i>	<i>Role of the Holy Spirit</i>
<b>John 14:15–31</b>	When Jesus was about to leave the disciples, he told them he would remain with them. How could this be? The Counselor, Helper, Advocate, Spirit of Truth—the Spirit of God himself—would come to care for and guide the disciples after Jesus was gone. The Holy Spirit is a powerful person on our side, working for and with us.
<b>John 20:22; Acts 1:8; 2; 4:8, 31; 13:52; Eph 5:18; Luke 11.13</b>	The regenerating power of the Spirit came on the disciples just before Jesus’ ascension, and the promised Spirit was poured out on all the believers at Pentecost, shortly after Jesus ascended to heaven. The Holy Spirit is the very presence of God within us. We can ask for and experience the Spirit’s fullness and power each day.
<b>John 14:16</b>	The Holy Spirit will be with us forever.
<b>John 14:17</b>	The Holy Spirit cannot be accepted by the world at large.
<b>John 14:17; Romans 8:9–14</b>	The Holy Spirit lives with us and in us. Although Jesus ascended to heaven, he sent the Holy Spirit to live in believers. To have the Holy Spirit is to have Jesus himself.
<b>John 14:26</b>	The Holy Spirit teaches us. As we study the Bible, we can trust the Holy Spirit to plant truth in our mind, convince us of God’s will, and remind us when we stray from it.
<b>John 14:26</b>	The Holy Spirit reminds us of Jesus’ words.
<b>John 15:26; Luke 12:11-12</b>	The Holy Spirit gives strength to endure the unreasonable hostility many have toward Christ. This is especially comforting for those facing persecution.
<b>John 16:8</b>	The Holy Spirit convicts us of sin, shows us God’s righteousness, and announces God’s judgment on evil.
<b>John 16:13</b>	The Holy Spirit guides into truth and gives insight into future events. The truth is the truth about Christ.
<b>John 16:14</b>	The Holy Spirit brings glory to Christ.
<b>Acts 8:29; 13:2; 13:4; 16:6</b>	The Holy Spirit guides us into ministry opportunities.
<b>Romans 8:1–14</b>	The Holy Spirit sets us free from the power of our sin nature.
<b>Romans 8:9</b>	The Holy Spirit is essential to belonging to Christ.
<b>Romans 8:16; Galatians 4:6–7</b>	The Holy Spirit assures us that we are God’s children.
<b>Romans 8:26–27; Eph 6:18</b>	The Holy Spirit intercedes for us in our weakness and in our prayers.
<b>1 Corinthians 12-14</b>	The Holy Spirit equips us with supernatural ministry abilities.
<b>Galatians 5:16-25</b>	The Holy Spirit forms the character of Christ in us.
<b>Ephesians 1:13–14</b>	The Holy Spirit seals us for eternity.
<b>Ephesians 6:10-18</b>	The Holy Spirit equips us for spiritual warfare.
<b>1 Thess 5:19; Acts 5:3-4, 9; 7.51; Matt 12.31-32</b>	The Holy Spirit can be resisted, quenched, or even lied to! This is dangerous!
